Letter from the Rector

Beloved Community of St. Andrew's,

One hundred years ago, on October 7, 1921, a new church community gathered in Longmeadow for the first time, with a yearning to worship God, to learn and grow together, and to live out their faith right here in Longmeadow. In the first hundred years since that day, St. Andrew's has grown into a large, vibrant church community with the same passion for worshiping God, learning and growing in community, living our faith, and sharing God's abundant love, here in Longmeadow and beyond. We have been blessed to have a beautiful church building as a hub for everything we do as a church community— gifts given to us by those first St. Andrew's members, and all the faithful generations since that day.

The question we face now is—What is the legacy we will leave for the generations of faithful people yet to come in our next hundred years?

How can we care for and preserve the resources that we have been given, while also leaving a legacy that is more than a building, but has the power to sustain flourishing ministries here at and in the wider world for years to come.

There is a reason this campaign is not focused on new project construction—we have been given what we need to do the work to which we have been called. We must focus our attention on more than just our building, however, because the building is not the church. We are the church. The building is a resource that helps us to live out our call, which is to share God's love in the world around us. As we look ahead at our next hundred years, what can we do now to ensure that the mission and ministries to which God has called us continue to grow and flourish? How can we become a church known for the impact we have in the world around us, a community who loves deeply, who is nurtured and restored by our time in community together, so that we can go back out with more love for all of God's children.

I hope you will join me on this journey as we make our way forward into the future to which God is calling us. No doubt there will be countless surprises, but I wouldn't want to take this journey anywhere else.

1915: Sunday School children met in private homes

1921: The mission of St. Andrew's conducted worship in a vacant store front

1924: St. Andrew's Episcopal Church on Longmeadow Street is completed

1964: The Parish House and Old Stone Church are tied together for a bigger building

2000: Over \$1,000,000 capital campaign for the renovation of the undercroft, main entrance, installation of the pipe organ and the support of a Habitat for Humanity House

2008: \$500,000 Capital and Mission campaign that was split between deferred maintenance and the establishment of Church Without Walls

2011 to Today: Liturgical innovations including the Celtic Service, Contemplative Prayer, many mission projects to support the world around us, creation of the Prayground, a growing and busy parish.

OUR NEEDS AND OPPORTUNITIES

Sanctuary: \$500,000

- Preservation work on stained glass windows
- Install wood flooring over existing asbestos tiles
- Repairs/Improvements to chapel walls and roof
- Replace existing lighting with LED, easily accessible fixtures
- Installing stops and pipes for 3rd organ keyboard (choir)

Property: \$500,000

- Repair slate in columbarium
- Replace single pane glass windows with energy efficient windows
- Build Main level storage
- Install new flooring in the youth room and choir over asbestos tile
- Update Narthex bathrooms
- Update kitchenette in St. Andrew's Room
- Repave driveway
- Scrape / repair/ repaint exterior of St A Room

Operations: \$10,000

- New Phone System + Data Cabling Basement
- Security Camera and Unlock system for Slype door

Mission: \$120,000

- Foster Closet: Washer/Dryer and hookups, storage shed for furniture items, donation shed, rolling racks
- Mission Project Reserves
- Support the community by resolving local medical debt

Finance: \$289,000

- Eliminate debt for heating and cooling system
- Capital reserve fund
- Build endowment
- Capital Campaign Expenses

Total: \$1,419,000
